### **PROGRAM UPDATES:**

Joana Wells and Tiffany Shirley reported that with the SPF Grant, Coalition staff has been working with Carlsbad Intermediate School faculty to administer All-Stars Prevention Programming virtually with students. For Teens In Action, the group has planned some Spring Break activities for local youth to include a kickball and relay race event to take place at the Bob Forrest Sports Complex. The events will take place from 1PM to 4PM on the Tuesday and Thursday of Spring Break. Julie Fuentes reported that her program (TOP) has been helping plan the Spring Break activities. The TOP Club held 3 meetings in February with youth at the JMA School. Students there helped create Valentine's Day crafts for the San Jose Senior Center and helped with the school's Candy Gram project as well. Julie went on to report that Eddy County Teen Court began having in person full hearings and held 3 cases on February 21<sup>st</sup>. Joana Wells announced that local attorney Mark Horton has agreed to help with the program and volunteered to participate as a Teen Court judge. The group is meeting every Monday and is now using the City of Carlsbad Janell Whitlock Municipal Annex Building for their trials. Julie and Joana explained to the

Board attendees the process of Eddy County Teen Court, including the referral process, judgments, and main issues that are addressed in in the Court. Joana expressed that she would love to see the programs expanded to Loving schools in the future. For OSAP, Samantha Smith reported that 192 reusable bags provided by Keep Carlsbad Beautiful, were distributed recently along with Safe Storage and Disposal information through the Meals on Wheels program. She also stated that new safe storage and disposal bag tags will be delivered to local pharmacies in March. Samantha went on to report that the next Household Hazardous Waste/Rx Takeback Day will be held on Saturday, May 21<sup>st</sup> at the Carlsbad Beach from 8AM to 2PM.

**NEW BUSINESS/ANNOUNCEMENTS:** Joana Wells reported that the new annual community surveys are ready for the taking. Flyers with the QR Code and link were passed out. She also asked Board attendees for ideas to cover in the upcoming Strategic Planning Meeting. CPD Community Relations Officer Mike Shott reported for the Carlsbad Police Dept. that in February 2022 the following occurred: 1,502 traffic citations were issued with 14 of those were marijuana related, 10 DWI arrests were made, and finally, 26 drug/alcohol arrests were made.
